## Status of Women and Children in Cumberland County, NC Highlighting Areas of Basic Needs

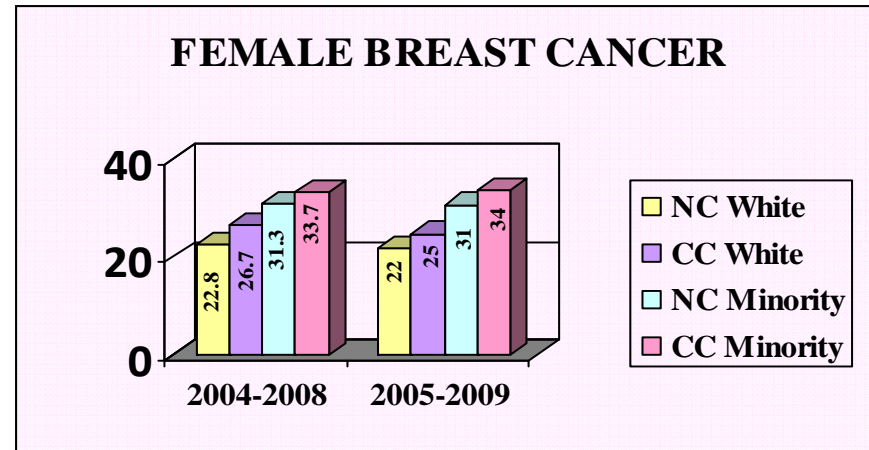

Leading Causes of Female Mortality Rate (/100,000)



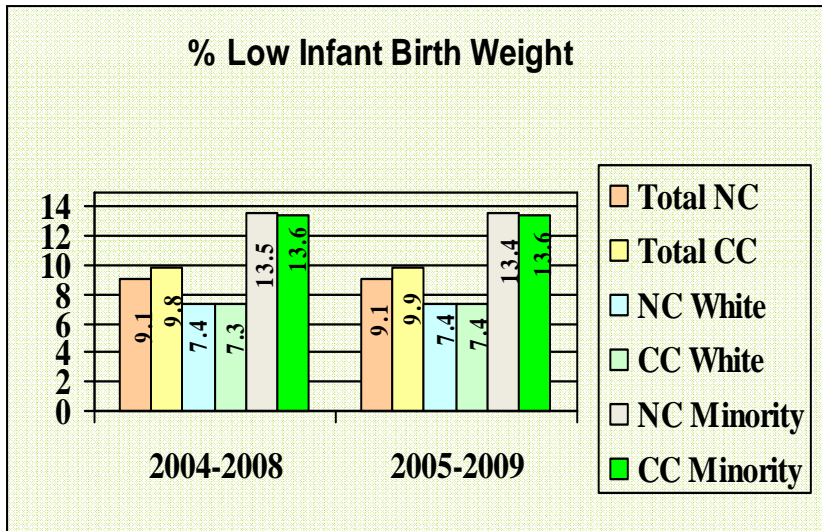
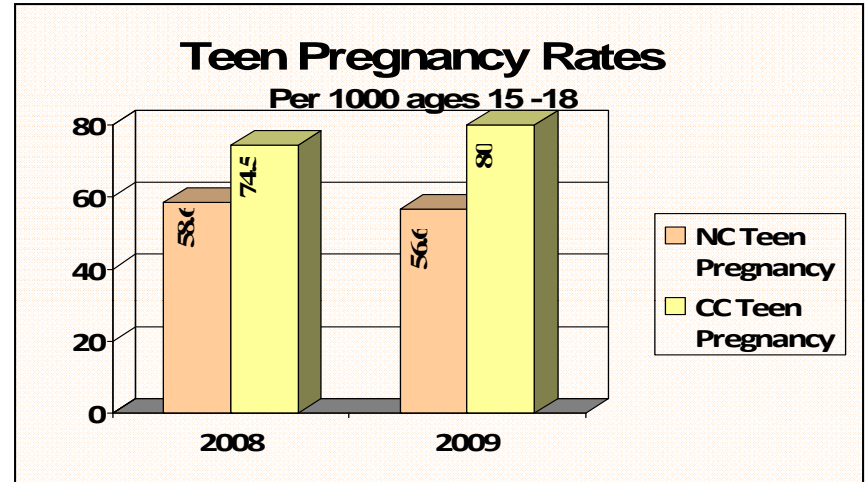

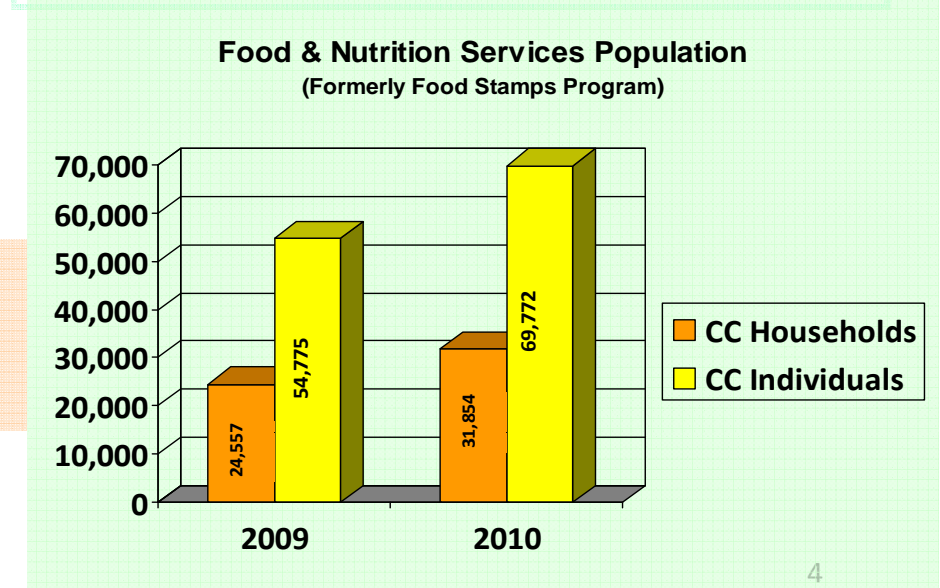

**47% of children under 5** years of age, raised by a single mom, live in poverty. By contrast, fewer than 7% of children in two-parent households live below federal poverty levels.

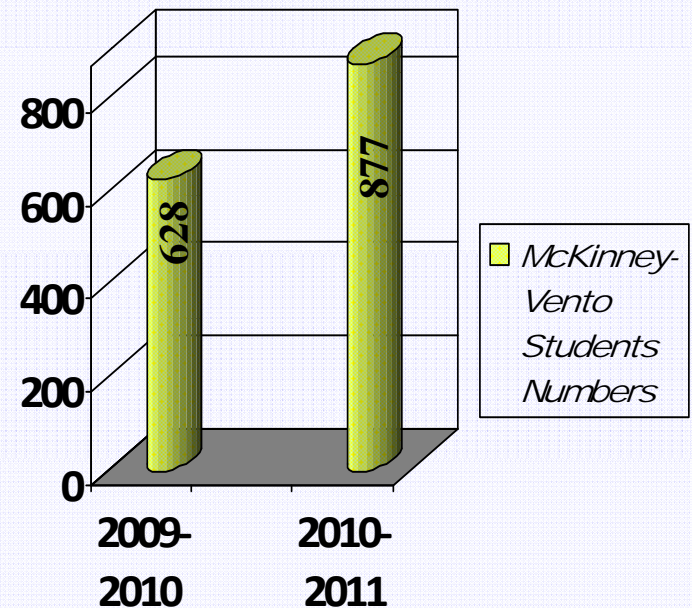

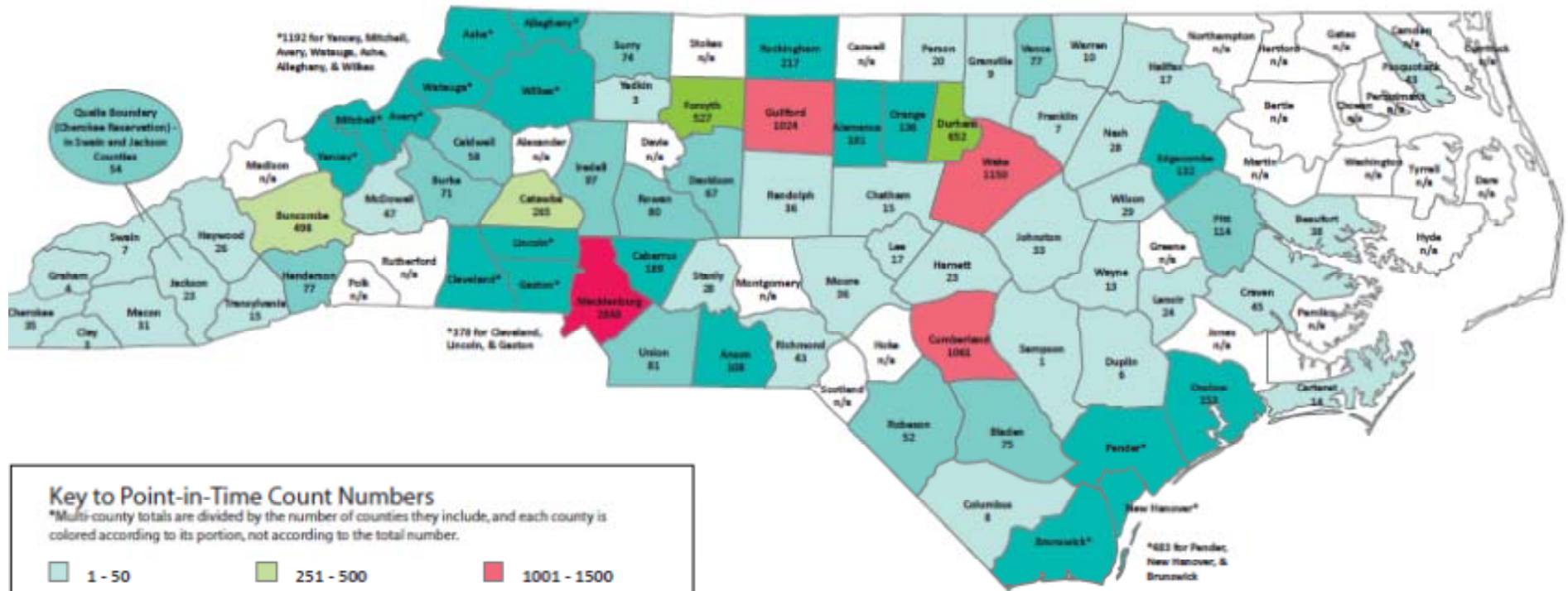

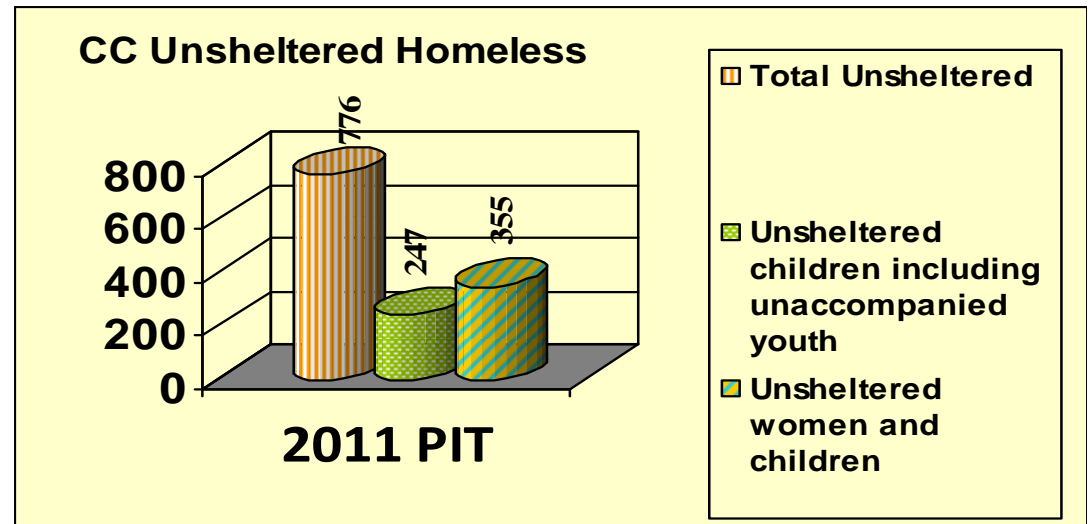

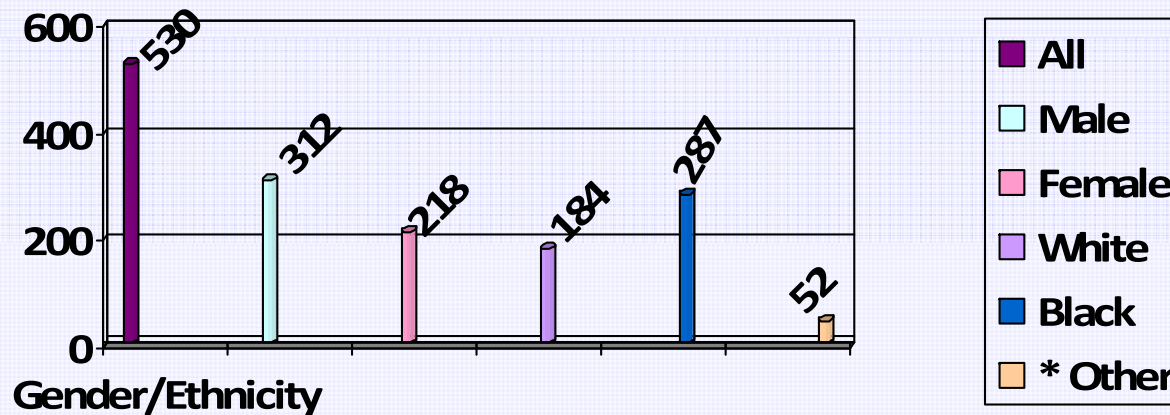

Cumberland County Schools received \$134,000 grant in 2010 for The Valued Youth Program which is a collaborative effort between Cumberland County Schools, Communities in Schools, and the Intercultural Development Research Association (IDRA). The primary purpose of this program is to transform at-risk youth by empowering them as Student Leaders. High School Student Leaders are trained as peer tutors and serve as volunteers in elementary classrooms.

### APPENDIX A

## **McKinney-Vento Definition of "Homeless"**

**Subtitle B of Title VII of the McKinney-Vento Homeless Assistance Act (Title X, Part C, of the No Child Left Behind Act) defines "homeless" as follows:**

The term "homeless children and youths"—

- (A) means individuals who lack a fixed, regular, and adequate nighttime residence (within the meaning of section 103(a)(1)); and
- (B) includes--
- (i) children and youths who are sharing the housing of other persons due to loss of housing, economic hardship, or a similar reason; are living in motels, hotels, trailer parks, or camping grounds due to the lack of alternative adequate accommodations; are living in emergency or transitional shelters; are abandoned in hospitals; or are awaiting foster care placement;
  - (ii) children and youths who have a primary nighttime residence that is a public or private place not designed for or ordinarily used as a regular sleeping accommodation for human beings (within the meaning of section 103(a)(2)(C));
  - (iii) children and youths who are living in cars, parks, public spaces, abandoned buildings, substandard housing, bus or train stations, or similar settings; and
  - (iv) migratory children (as such term is defined in section 1309 of the Elementary and Secondary Education Act of 1965) who qualify as homeless for the purposes of this subtitle because the children are living in circumstances described in clauses (i) through (iii).

## Information Reported from PIT Count

- **Purpose:** To understand the number and characteristics of people sleeping in shelters and the street, or in other places not meant for human habitation
- **Required Data:** Unduplicated ONE-NIGHT count of sheltered and unsheltered adults, children, and youth with Subpopulation information
- **The following information is reported in PART1 of the Population and Subpopulations Chart in the McKinney-Vento application :**
  - Counts of sheltered and unsheltered adults, children, and unaccompanied youth.
  - Unsheltered Homeless people- reside in places not meant for human habitation, such as cars, parks, sidewalks, abandoned buildings, on the street
  - Sheltered Homeless People reside in emergency shelter or transitional housing (including hotel or motel vouchers for homeless people)
  - Counts of the number of individuals, numbers of families and number of persons in families
